Wagga Wagga Championship History

92 years ago, the first 'Demo' was conducted by the Board of Fire Commissioners of NSW at Wagga Wagga.

Whilst this was our first official competition, this activity began 50 years previously, when the United Volunteer Fire Brigades Association held a 'Grand Intercolonial Fire Brigade Competition' in November 1881. The Metropolitan Associated Fire Brigades responded with its First Annual Gathering in March 1882.

The 1880s and 1890s saw Demonstrations held regularly in Sydney, Newcastle, Lambton, Waratah, Bathurst and Goulburn, with Brigades from across the State and Victoria competing. Competition was strong between the colonies, where 24 NSW Metropolitan and Country brigades were among 110 brigades competing at Sandhurst (Bendigo Vic) in 1882.

Following Federation 'NSW State Demonstrations' were conducted at Armidale, Forbes, Orange, Dubbo and the last 'Demo' at Corowa in 1909, before the formation of NSWFB in 1910.

The Board's solicitors Messrs. Pigott & Stinson in 1920 reported to the Board -

"We are of the opinion that the Board might make By-laws providing for contests which would in their opinion, would conduce to the efficiency and discipline of Fire Brigades and stimulate zeal in the particular exercises which render the members more valuable as firemen."

Demos were conducted from the 1880s regularly in Victoria and WA with NSWFB officials investigating during the 1920s the possibility of following suit in NSW.

In July 1931 at the Southern Division Convention at Junee it was resolved to hold a Demonstration at Wagga Wagga. 53 NSW brigades were joined by 16 Victorian teams in the first Demonstration under the NSWFB in October 1932.

Lithgow were the first winners of the Alfred Webb Cup, followed by Lockhart, Orange, Tamworth and Queanbeyan.

In 1962 Wagga again hosted the 10th State Demonstration, 60 teams from throughout the state competed. Wagga's neighbours Narrandera winning the 5th of their 6 State titles. Blackheath, Grafton, Sawtell and Bellingen making up the top five places. Portland winning the trophy for the best performance by a new team.

Narrandera's win was not without controversy, as Blackheath had finished the week of competition on 98 points to Narrandera 94 whose second in the Discipline event saw them win the Alfred Webb Cup 104 to 98.

MSA Safety Trophy



This Trophy is very prestigious with a history from the mining industry in Pennsylvania and West Virginia in the early 1900s – there are only four in existence. The Trophy depicts a worker (miner) coming home at the end of the shift to his family. Internationally this Trophy is recognised as one of the highest awards for safety and is called the JT Ryan Trophy in memory of the founder of MSA and their established commitment to safety.

JT Ryan experienced directly the impact of a mine explosion in West Virginia in 1913 with a significant loss of life. From that incident came the formation of MSA, the Safety Company in 1914 with the company mission "...to see that men and women may work in safety and that they, their families and communities may live in health throughout the world" clearly something close to all Firefighters.

The JT Ryan Trophy remains the premier safety award in Canada. The original mould was broken when a second trophy was struck. The Trophy is provided to the FCA in recognition of the implementation of the new WHS and safety requirements. It was made from the last mould taken from the original trophy in Canada. No more plans are in place to duplicate.

The essence of providing this award to the FCA comes from the history of firefighting, the alignment with the "MSA" mission and the genesis of the award. Firefighters today provide essential search and rescue functions in many environments and are intimately reflective of the desires, concerns and commitments of JT Ryan when establishing MSA nearly 100 years ago. In many ways, today's modern firefighters are kindred spirits in word and deed. It seems fitting the two go together in recognition of commitment and excellence.

Safety Trophy – Point Score

The Safety Trophy is awarded to the Brigade, over the State Championship, who has incurred the least safety penalties during competition and is judged to always display safe practices on the track.

A team is eliminated from the Safety Trophy event if it is disqualified in any event.

2023-2024 Regional Championships Review

Returning to Wagga where Demonstrations under the NSWFB began in 1932, the four Regional Championships provide us with an opportunity to assess the performances of brigades attending the 40th State Championships.

The Urban Pumper events have been dominated at the four Region Championships by 2018 and 2022 Alfred Webb Cup winners Wyong.

Urban Pump Collector and Ladder - 2 of 4 wins, Urban Pump Disable - 2 of 4 wins, Booster Valve & High Rise Bag – 3 of 4, BA & Foam Event – 3 of 4, and Urban Suction, Wyong winning at all four of the Region Championships. Kootingal, Echuca and the 'evergreen' Trangie crew the next best performers in the Motor Events. Two of the newer teams, Ulladulla the best at Tumut in the Urban Pump Collector and Ladder, and Murrurundi winning the Rescue Event at Parkes proved that the newcomers are amongst the mix with the more experienced teams.

Kootingal's dominance in hose events over the last decade at Region and State Championships shows no sign of changing, Hose Hydrant & Extinguisher, Kootingal were successful in 3 of the 4 Region Championships, Hose & Hydrant 4 Competitors – 2 of 4, Hose & Hydrant 2 Competitors - 3 of 4. Wellington, Wyong, Echuca and Busby have each been successful where Kootingal has been runner up in the hose events.

In the three runnings of the Ladder Event, Wyong, Kootingal and Dubbo have been successful, with Ulladulla and Merrylands providing competition.

History in State Championship success, created by female firefighters Judith Alderdice of Wyong and Cassandra Dickson of Bega, has paved the way for many others, and the enthusiasm exhibited by the female crews from Ulladulla and Culcairn has set a great example for others to follow.

The support of FRNSW Championships by NSW RFS team Moonbi-Kootingal and Victorian CFA team Echuca is much to be admired, the two teams achieving considerable success as they travel across the State to compete.

The awarding of the Alfred Webb Cup, for the most successful team would appear to be a contest between Wyong, winners at the last two State Championships, Kootingal who have six top five finishes, including runners up on the last three occasions and Echuca and Trangie.

We look forward to another successful Championships where the NSWFB began their involvement some 92 years ago.

Discipline/Groundmanship Event



Object and Eligibility

The “Discipline Event” has been redesigned to reflect a more modern format that includes not only marching but also the important disciplines of sportsmanship, conduct, work ethics and dress code.

Background

State and Regional/Metropolitan Championships are consistently reviewed and developed to reflect current FRNSW needs.

With the recent transition of the five days, State Championship to a three day State Championship, current events required a further review to ensure a full three-day program could be successfully conducted.

The “Discipline Event” was identified as one event that should undergo a review, as it would enable the FCA to save time for both Competitors and Officials.

The Discipline Event has been modified to accommodate the three day State Championship program.

Over the past seven years, the Regional/Metropolitan Championships have provided a Discipline Award in which Firefighters are judged on the following measures both on and off the track:

- Sportsmanship
- Conduct
- Work ethics
- Dress code (wearing of safety gear)

Result

To ensure a component of the original Discipline Event is maintained for State Championships, nominated judges will assess each team’s ability to march onto the track for the Official Opening, thus ensuring competitors are judged on their ability to march, display appropriate sportsmanship, conduct, work ethics (track clearance) and the wearing of correct uniform over three days of competition.

The Director, two Assistant Directors and the President of the FCA will judge the Discipline Event at the State Championship as they currently do at Regional/Metropolitan Championships.

Note – The listed Officers do not march in the Official Opening Ceremony and therefore are capable of adding this task to their current lists of duties that they similarly perform for Regional/Metropolitan Championships

The Director, two Assistant Directors and the President of the FCA shall confer prior to the conclusion of the Championship to decide which team will receive the Discipline Award for the Championship.

Trophy, Prizemoney, Medals and Certificates will continue to be awarded, however, no points for this event will be awarded.

Presentation will take place at the Official Presentation Evening.

Event 1. Urban Pump Booster Valve/Ladder and Internal Hose Reel

This event simulates teams having to extinguish a fire in a multi-storey building using a boosted water system, an internal building hose reel line and 38mm hose from the first floor.

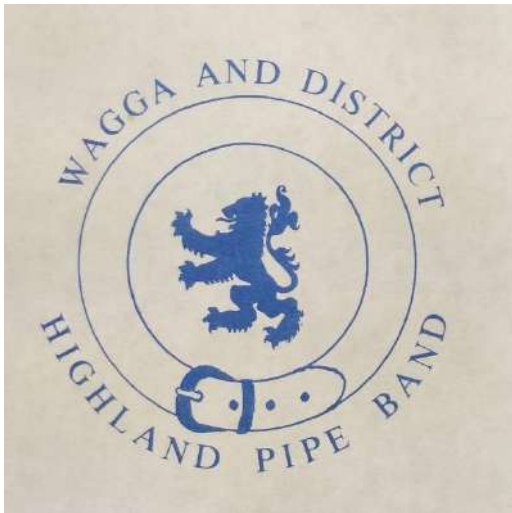

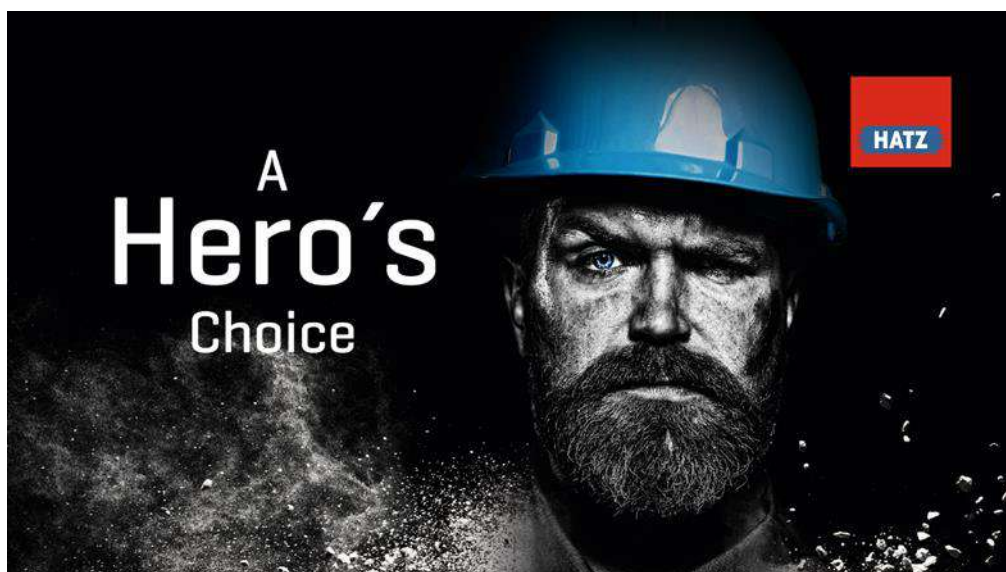
